

SAMPLE CLUB CHARTER

(High school name) HIGH SCHOOL FIGURE SKATING CLUB CHARTER

Note: High School Figure Skating Clubs will be called HSAC's in this document to differentiate them from USFSA/ISI clubs.

I. GOAL

The goal of this HSAC is to provide a vehicle where by high school students may participate in the sport of figure skating as an extra-curricular "club" activity.

II. HSAC MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA

HSAC members must meet the academic grade requirements established at the (high school name). These standards are: (list here)

III. HSAC STRUCTURE

The HSAC is a non-profit club whereby any and all fees paid by its members will be used for promotion of figure skating.

Leadership and guidance for the HSAC and its membership will be the responsibility of (who based on your school's policies will oversee your club) on a volunteer basis.

HSAC meetings will be held (depending on school policy).

The HSAC can apply for USFSA Affiliated Club Membership to provide the following benefits:

- To encourage participation by USFSA member skaters
- To provide USFSA judging standards, scheduling and official accounting procedure at USFSA sanctioned interscholastic competitive events.
- To provide insurance coverage at USFSA sanctioned high school competitive events.
- To provide high school representation of the HSAC membership during high school events.
- To provide protection of those USFSA HSAC members' amateur skating status.

IV. HSAC EXPENSES

All expenses will be the responsibility of the HSAC's membership with no financial obligation to the high school. These expenses will be split by the club's participating members.

All training and ice time to prepare for figure skating competition will be paid by the membership on a per person basis.
