Series Details:

- Groups will be limited to 6 skaters at each competition
- Points will be applied in the following way: the skater who places 1st will receive 6 points, the skater who places 2nd will receive 5 points, the skater who places 3rd will receive 4 points, the skater who places 4th will receive 3 points, the skater who places 5th will receive 2 points and the skater who places 6th will receive 1 point. If there is only 1 skater in the group then the maximum points given is 3. If there are 2 skaters in a group then the skater that places 1st will receive 3 points and the skater that places 2nd will receive 2 points.
- Skaters will receive 3 points for each level they move up with a maximum of 6 points received per season. Skaters will not receive points for skating a level lower than in the previous competition in the series.
- Series winners of each event will need to move up to the next level for the upcoming 2023-24 series.
